



# TRIABUNNA & ORFORD PLACED ON STAGE 1 WATER RESTRICTIONS

as Launceston, Lady Barron and Bridport asked to remain alert

Orford and Triabunna in the State's south-east will be placed on stage 1 water restrictions from Monday, 25 March 2024 to help maintain water supply to the town over the Easter break.

TasWater Head of Communications and Engagement, Callan Paske said Stage 1 water restrictions require only small changes to how people use water, but even small changes can have a significant impact on the amount of water available in the system.

"Many factors were considered before implementing restrictions for Orford and Triabunna, including the increased demand on the town's water supply during the annual influx of holiday visitors and the longer-term weather patterns in the region," Mr Paske said.

"Implementing these restrictions will help us ensure water is available when residents, visitors and businesses turn on their taps."

Notices will be placed in The Mercury newspaper and on TasWater's website to inform the public of the restrictions.

Targeted social media posts will also be used to inform the community.

Stage 1 restrictions aim to reduce non-essential water use by 20 per cent by encouraging more conscious use of water at home and at work.

"We thank the community for their cooperation to reduce water use and encourage all Tasmanians to consider their water use, as it is a finite resource," Mr Paske said.

"With today [Friday 22 March] also being World Water Day, it is a timely reminder that water is a limited resource and demand for it is increasing.

"We encourage Orford and Triabunna locals to spread the word on water conservation and its importance to people visiting the town."

Meanwhile, after a hot, dry summer, residents in Launceston, Lady Barron and Bridport are urged to continue water conservation efforts to help avoid restrictions in their communities in the period ahead.

# MITCHELL ASKS MINISTER ABOUT 3G SWITCHOVER CONCERNS

The impending closure of the Australian 3G mobile network and changeover to 4G and 5G services is causing anxiety in some areas of the community, especially amongst people in regional areas.

Of particular concern is the fact a small number of people own a subset of 4G phones that manufacturers have configured to only use 3G for triple zero calls. People with this subset may be simply unaware their 4G phones will be unable to make 000 calls when the 3G signal is switched off.

In addition to the remaining 3G phones still in the community, many owned by older people living in regional and rural communities, some EFTPOS machines and medical alarms are also configured to only use 3G, which their owners may be unaware of.

Collectively, up to 740,000 devices will be impacted by the switching off of the 3G signal.

This week in Question Time I asked Communications Minister Michelle Rowland about the process surrounding the changeover, and what the Australian Government was doing to ensure community safety would be maintained.

Minister Rowland acknowledged the community concerns and said she was not satisfied the telecommunications sector was doing enough to identify, inform and assure impacted customers.

Minister Rowland told the parliament that immediate action was needed, which was why she had directed mobile operators to get their heads together to develop better identification and information, and to update her fortnightly on progress.

The Minister noted the Government has the option to delay the switchover if it is determined to be in the public interest.

The Albanese Government takes this issue extremely seriously and will insist that community connectivity and safety is maintained.

## WHAT DO STAGE 1 WATER RESTRICTIONS MEAN?

Stage 1 restrictions are intended to enforce sensible water use and prevent inefficient water practices by reducing non-essential use of water by about 20 per cent.

## Residential, public and commercial gardens and lawns

Garden and lawn watering is allowed on any day during the following times:

- Manual watering systems can only be used between the hours of 6am and 8am, and between the hours of 8pm and 10pm.
- Automatic watering systems can only be used between the hours of midnight and 4am.
- Handheld hoses with a trigger nozzle, buckets or watering cans may be used at any time.

### **Sporting grounds**

Watering of sports grounds is allowed on any day during the following times:

- Manual watering systems can only be used between the hours of 6am and 8am and between the hours of 8pm and 10pm.
- Automatic watering systems can only be used between the hours of midnight and 4am.
- Handheld hoses with a trigger nozzle, buckets or watering cans may be used at any time.

## Paving, concrete and other hard surfaces

- Spot cleaning for safety, health, animal welfare or emergency reasons with a hose fitted with a trigger nozzle or with high pressure cleaning equipment is permitted.
- For construction, using water for dust or pollutant suppression, or earth compaction by means of a hose fitted with a flow cut-off device or a vehicle fitted with sprinklers is permitted.
- Hosing for general cleaning of hard surfaces such as paths, driveways and paved areas is not permitted at any time.

## Washing vehicles

- A bucket, high pressure cleaning device or commercial car wash can be used at any time for vehicle washing.
- A handheld hose fitted with a trigger nozzle can only be used for prerinsing and rinsing at home.



## Residential or commercial pools and spas
